

Deputy Chief Justice Visits Kabale High Court

The Deputy Chief Justice, Hon. Justice Dr. Flavian Zeija, on Friday afternoon visited the Kabale High Court as part of ongoing efforts to assess court operations and explore avenues for improved service delivery.

He was received by the Resident Judge, Hon. Justice Karoli Lwanga Ssemogerere, who presented a comprehensive briefing on the administrative strategies

implemented to expedite case adjudication and enhance court efficiency.

Justice Karoli highlighted on the use of diversion mechanisms to refer appropriate matters to alternative stakeholders, effectively easing the court's caseload.



To mark the occasion, the Deputy Chief Justice planted a banana sucker upon arrival—a symbolic gesture representing growth and continuity.

He later toured the court premises and was formally introduced to various stakeholders, including the Resident District Commissioner (RDC), the Regional Senior State Attorney from the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (ODPP), judicial officers from the Chief Magistrates' Courts of Kisoro and Kabale, and administrative staff led by Assistant Registrar HW Kenneth Tumwebaze. Also present were members of the Bar and local religious leaders.

The Deputy Chief Justice emphasized the importance of teamwork, inter-institutional collaboration, and the integration of technology in enhancing

justice delivery. He expressed satisfaction with the overall state of the Circuit and pledged to address the deficiencies and resource gaps identified during the visit.
